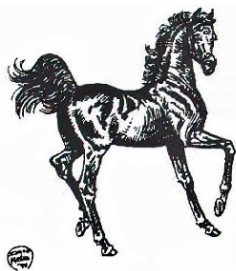

They can be nominated either by downloading the form from the NYSMHS web site or can be done directly on line from the web site <https://www.newyorkmorgans.com/nysmhs-futurity/>. It pays to nominate all your foals, prize money for the In Hand classes, and prize money for the Alumni classes. Once your foal is a graduate of the Futurity it doesn't stop there, your foal is nominated for LIFE . If you sell your foal before it's a three year old , the original nominator still can win prize money if you nominated the sire and/or dam of the Champion and Reserve Champion in hand.

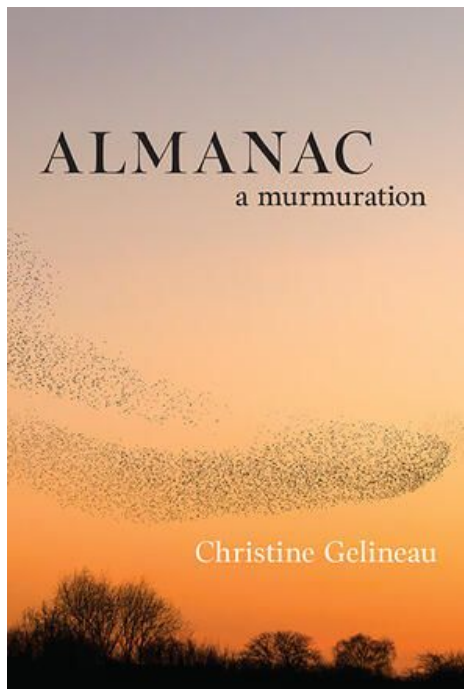
Alumni classes are held in six divisions, English PLeasure, Western Pleasure, Driving (any style), Hunter Pleasure, Classic Pleasure, and Dressage. Enter one or all there is \$1500 in prize money every year. In addition, by showing in the Alumni classes you are qualified for the respective championship! Win-win!

Get those nominations in. All nominations must be paid for by 5:00PM the day before the New York Morgan Regional show starts. This year, that is September 9, 2025. After that date the fees are doubled. Nominations for weanlings are accepted until 12/31/25. Exciting information about the USA Working Equitation Clinic held at Nash Hill Equestrian center on April 26, 2025

USA Working Equitation is a sport focusing on horse and rider partnership, with varying levels that can be enjoyed by riders from beginners up through experience, competitive riders. The clinic held April 26 at Nash Hill Equestrian Center, Persia, NY, introduced riders to the Obstacle element of working Equitation. The obstacles can be scored on Ease of Handling or Speed Times when performed in a competitive format, but the clinic was a fun introduction to the sport in general. There was plenty of hands-on experience learning the various obstacles, and an opportunity for all riders to make it through the entire course at the end of the clinic. The fun, supportive atmosphere, and the outstanding facility made this a clinic to remember.

Michelle Lackey and Stephani Kame are knowledgeable instructors and accomplished competitors in Working Equitation. The Nash Hill Center hosts this clinic every year, and those with Sport horses, or really any Morgan, may consider attending the clinic next seasons when it is held again.

This year's clinic was favored with a number of Morgans who thoroughly enjoyed the clinic. Both Dawn Tocha, with M lama Rock Starr, and Lisa Towne, with Stilwell Beauty Queen have attended this clinic twice now. Dawn commented about the clinic, "My favorite part is the challenge of negotiating the new and different obstacles with this inquisitive young horse, I think he loves it as much as I do!". Lisa enjoyed the challenge of negotiating the obstacles and introducing her mare to new and different experiences. Eric and Sue Trammel brought RBD Legacy's Tru Victor and Melrog Willow B Wild to the clinic for the first time. The Trammels thought the instructors were great, with friendly, outgoing demeanors. Eric Trammel commented, "The variety and partnership with our horses was fun. It showcased a variety of skills required for sport".

The Carriage Dog Class

One of the most popular classes at any carriage competition is undoubtedly Carriage Dog. Since a great many horse lovers also love dogs, it stands to reason that we'd want to include our canine companions in as many horse-related activities as possible. Taking our dogs along on a drive down the road --- or in the show ring -- in a carriage provides the perfect opportunity to do just that.

According to the American Driving Society, the main governing body of our sport, the rules of the Carriage Dog class can be summarized as follows: the class is judged primarily on the suitability of the dog to serve as a companion. All breeds are welcome. The dog must be standing, lying down, or seated on the carriage, should not interfere with the driver in any way, and must not be led on the ground from the vehicle or be tied to the vehicle, passenger or driver. Judges should excuse unruly, out-of-control dogs. As an alternative, the dog may run on the ground close to the carriage (next to or behind the carriage) but should not stray far from it. The "job" of the carriage dog, first and foremost, is to be a pleasant and trouble-free companion.

The turnout should be judged both ways of the arena at the walk, slow trot, and working trot. Judges should award their placings based 60% on the suitability of the dog to serve as a companion, 30% on the performance, manners, and horse's way of going, and 10% on the overall impression of the turnout, including the dog. As a fun variation, the judge may call for audience participation, in the form of applause, to place the class. However, if this method is to be used, it should be stated in the prize list/Omnibus.

The attire of the driver should be the same as in any other carriage pleasure class; hat, whip, gloves, and apron/knee rug are required. Dogs may be leashed and should absolutely not be in a costume of any kind. If a competitor simply *must* accessorize their dog, it should enhance, not detract from, the overall turnout. Carriage Dog is NOT a costume class.

If you compete in the carriage division and think that your beloved canine has what it takes, by all means give this fun and unusual class a try wherever it is offered.

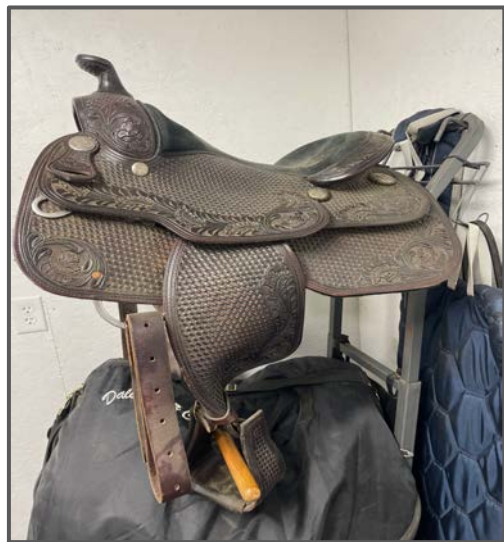
